Get Ready for E-Waste and Tire Recycling Day!



Crews from last year's E-Waste and Tire Recycling Day unload materials from customers' cars. This year's event will be held at **Vallejo Garbage Service** on Saturday, April 21.

Tire Recycling Day on Saturday, April 21, from 8 AM until 3 PM. Commercial and residential customers may bring an unlimited amount of common electronic office equipment including computer monitors and television screens with cathode ray tubes to the 2021 Broadway location for disposal. Up to 10 used tires may also be dropped off at the event. There is no charge to bring materials to the E-Waste and Tire event.

"This is an important day for all of our customers," explains **Vallejo Garbage Service** General Manager Peter Friesen. "It is especially important to our business customers who have upgraded their office equipment and computer systems. You can bring your obsolete equipment to us for no charge. This is the fifth event we have hosted so we make sure the process is efficient."

A large number of local volunteers and employees from the City of Vallejo will greet customers at the gate. They will collect vital information before customers enter the disposal area. Customers

must have proof that their business or residence is in Vallejo. Employees of **VGS** will then unload all materials from vehicles.

It's time to gather your unwanted electronic equipment and used tires. **Vallejo Garbage Service** will host an E-Waste and

"Many businesses in Vallejo plan their annual cleaning around the E-Waste Recycling event," said Friesen. "This service offers an easy way to deal with items that are difficult and expensive to dispose of."

After collection the equipment is broken down for recycling. The glass goes to a recycling facility. Eight to ten pounds of lead are recovered from each of the televisions and monitors. The plastic goes to a plastic recycler, and the precious metals in the devices are also recovered. All of the materials remain in California.

Used tires will also be collected on this day from residential and commercial customers. There is a limit of ten tires per customer. Crews from **VGS** will empty the tires from your vehicle.
